From I-880 southbound:

1. Take exit #15/Auto Mall Parkway - go 0.3 mi
2. Turn left on Auto Mall Parkway - go 1.8 mi
3. Turn right to take ramp onto I-680 north toward Sacramento - go 2.4 mi
4. Take exit #16/Mission Blvd. - go 0.2 mi
5. Turn right on Mission Blvd. - go 0.5 mi
6. Turn right on Washington Blvd.
7. Arrive at 123 Washington Blvd., on the right

From I-880 northbound:

1. Take Mission Blvd. exit onto Mission Blvd. (CA-262 E) toward Sacramento (I-680) - go 4.3 mi
2. Turn left on Washington Blvd.
3. Arrive at 123 Washington Blvd., on the right
